Rome was considered the quintessential stop on the Grand Tour, as it represented both privileged access to the historical heritage of previous centuries and the wonders of the Baroque era. The artists' works, particularly the views of Rome and archaeological sites, helped shape and spread the imagery of the Grand Tour, creating a "myth" of European antiquities and of Italy as a cultural destination. During the trip, young people could purchase, according to their means and means, numerous works of art and antiques and visit the ruins of Rome, as well as the recently rediscovered Pompeii and Herculaneum. This gave rise to the trend of creating "souvenirs,"
