Art Deco Pedestal Table Attributed to Jules LELEU 1930s Jules Leleu (1883-1961) is one of the greatest names in French Art Deco furniture. Born into a family of cabinetmakers, he founded the Leleu house in 1910, which became famous for its refinement, its exacting choice of materials, and its understated elegance. He collaborated with the greatest decorators of his time, designing prestigious ocean liners such as the "Normandie" and the "France," as well as embassies and official residences. His style is distinguished by a clever balance between tradition and modernity, playing on precious woods, fine marquetry, and clean lines. This pedestal table features a simple but solid line, a richly veined burl veneer, and a fluted central base that gives the piece its character. The squat
