Maurice Dufrene is a French cabinetmaker, interior designer, set designer and writer, born in 1876 in Paris and died in 1955 in Nogent-sur-Marne. Maurice Dufrene is co-founder in 1902 of the Society of Decorative Artists. In 1920 he created the Maîtrise workshop at Galeries Lafayette. He advocated mass production and worked with all materials: fabric, glass, wood, silver, ceramic. Through Henri Rapin he met Camille Tharaud for whom he created several forms of porcelain cups.
