Description

Large rectangular serving tray with handles, Louis XVI style, signed by Maison Christofle*, in finely chiseled silver-plated bronze decorated with a frieze of pearls around the edge and crossed ribbons on the handles, the guilloché background decorated in its center with an oval cartouche, from the late 19th-early 20th centuries. This tray is in good condition, superb quality. It is hallmarked on the back. Please note: micro-scratches and wear from time, the back will need to be re-cleaned, see photos. *Christofle is a French silversmith brand, founded in 1830 by Charles Christofle. Its master silversmith hallmarks were registered in 1845, the date of the first "silver-plated goldsmith" factory. At the end of the 19th century, Maison Christofle now produced silver-plated metal objects. Emperor
