Description

Delftware is a Dutch ceramic produced mainly from the 17th century in the Delft region, particularly known for its blue decorations on a white background, called "Delft Blue", inspired by Asian porcelain. Complete Delft fireplace set from the 19th century in earthenware and bronze in the Asian style. It consists of: - The clock: In porcelain represents a dragon, a bronze ring in the mouth, holding on its back the clock movement on an openwork base with a gilded bronze base, on four feet in the shape of a flower bud to ensure stability. The clockwork comes from the "Mouvement de Paris", surrounded by two other small dragons and surmounted by a rooster. No accident to note that the pendulum and the key are missing.
