The profile is widely open with a small, well-marked reserved foot. The interior has concentric grooves made on the wheel, characteristic of Campanian productions. Description: o Material: orange-brown paste o Shape: low cup with flared wall, rounded lip, narrow annular foot o Decoration: internal concentric grooves made on the wheel o Surface: black varnish covering the whole, with areas of wear, flaking and concretions due to burial o Technical traces: visible turning, fingerprints under the foot Use: These Campanian cups with
