Based in Golfe-Juan, on the French Riviera, they developed a unique aesthetic deeply connected to natural materials and craftsmanship. Their furniture is distinguished by the use of braided ropes, raw woods, and simple yet warm shapes, a departure from the ostentatious luxury of the pre-war era. They were part of an accessible, functional, and authentic design movement that valued handmade products and local resources (very avant-garde). This series of woven rope chairs perfectly illustrates their approach. With their solid wood frame and braided rope seat and back, they offer comfort, solidity, and timeless
