Description

Booksellers and print dealers on the quays of Paris, Notre-Dame in the distance -- signed Cam. Lively view of a quay of the Seine lined with booksellers. In the foreground, strollers, a mother and child, a small dog crossing the light; to the left, a newspaper vendor. In the background, Notre-Dame Cathedral, seen from the left bank. Parisian atmosphere of the 1930s/50s, milky sky and stone heated by the sun. In the tradition of picturesque urban views, the composition leads the eye towards the cathedral mass, a structuring focal point. Smooth and narrative writing, enhanced by vivid notations: typical silhouettes, quay flagstones modulated by an oblique light. Light palette -- stone ochres, grayish greens, muted blues -- serving a pleasant realism. The planes fit together precisely; the painter creates

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atmospheric depth through subtle gradations and a light veil of mist. Decorative and unifying subject, highly sought after for its evocation of the Paris of the booksellers.ArtistSigned lower left: Cam.
