INFANTRY AND CAVALRY OFFICER'S SWORD. 18TH CENTURY. Model 1788 French guard with one branch and straight quillon. The pommel is made of a grilled and plumed pommel. Wooden knuckle covered with an intact double braided filigree in very good condition. Asymmetrical bivalve lyre-shaped plate (from 1805 the furnishers offered the symmetrical or asymmetrical shell folded down into a keyboard). Straight blade with two sides and fullers, in its original blue and gilt patterns. On the heel, on the back of the blade the Solingen cipher on a gilt background. On one of the sides the initials "I.C. B" for Johann and Clémens Boegel, active under Louis XVI (The "C" by the addition of flourishes resembles a "G" and the "J" is simplified by an "I"), and opposite a decoration of undulating
