



Paris Porcelain Plate, Guy And Housel, Early 19th Century

Description

Delicate white porcelain plate decorated in its center with two roses bordered by foliage and surrounded by a garland and small golden leaves. The rim decoration is made up of garlands of roses and plant motifs in shades of pink, green, yellow, orange and gold. Stamp "GH/Rue Thirioux/à Paris" on the reverse. The Rue Thirioux factory was founded in the 1770s by André Marie Leboeuf in the then rapidly developing Chaussée d'Antin district. His work was noticed by Queen Marie-Antoinette, who decided to grant him her protection and commission several pieces for her Petit Trianon estate. He developed a production with a very flowery style, in keeping with the Queen's tastes. In 1794, Leboeuf sold his factory to Guy, who went into partnership with Housel. They chose to
