Antique frame with gilded trim. Eugène Paul, known as Gen Paul (1895-1975), a self-taught French artist, his first paintings from 1919 to 1924 were signed under the pseudonym Paul Trelade. He frequented the Bateau-Lavoir, was a friend of Juan Gris, who helped him greatly, and was close to other artists such as Maurice de Vlaminck, Franck-Will, and Maurice Utrillo. His works depict the dynamics of movement, are full of optimism, and reflect the joy of living. The themes of the circus, musicians, and racetracks are recurring. Some critics position Gen Paul as one of the precursors of abstract
