The cup and saucer have a gold background, decorated with a scattering of polychrome playing cards in trompe l'oeil, presented as if they had been thrown onto a table. Gold fillets on the edges. Dimension(s): Cup: Height. 6 cm - Length. 8.3 cm - Saucer: Diam. 13.2 cm, Condition(s): PERFECT CONDITION, Period: EMPIRE. VERY RARE DECOR Under the Empire (~1805-1815), salon sociability (hot water bottle, whist, quadrille) inspired trompe-l'oeil "playing card" decorations on Paris porcelain. The cards, painted in bright polychrome (French portrait: kings, queens and jacks mixed with point cards), appear to be thrown and overlap on a gold or polychrome background. The motif is found mainly on litron cups and their saucers. Several Parisian workshops use it (Dagoty, Nast,
