Description

A well-preserved Worcester porcelain dessert plate in the "Dragon in Compartments" pattern, c.1800. The layout derives from Kangxi famille-verte models introduced at Worcester c.1765-1768 and continued by Chamberlain: dragon and kylin in opposing panels, with vase and treasure reserves, neatly enamelled and gilt. The centre carries an armorial roundel from a commissioned service, the arms of the Bewicke (Bewick) family of Newcastle upon Tyne, Close House, Northumberland.
