Description

Early 16th century hasp chest lock with mechanism. Hasp locks, typical of medieval and Renaissance chests, are characterized by their mechanism of moving pins (hasps) operated by a key with a notched rod or bit. These locks, often made of wrought iron, were designed to secure precious goods in metal-reinforced wooden chests. These locks were used by merchants, nobles, and religious institutions to protect valuables, documents, or relics. Their relative complexity for the time made them a symbol of security and prestige.
