Le Cri de Paris was a French weekly political and satirical periodical (in some ways the genesis of the "Canard Enchaîné"), founded by Alexandre Natanson in January 1897. Linked at its beginnings to "La Revue Blanche", this press organ disappeared in June 1940, with the entry of German troops into Paris... Batch of 34 magazines, including 26 published between 01/28/1912 and 10/27/1912, (16th year): n° 783, 784, 785, 787, 788, 789, 790, 791, 792, 793, 796, 797, 800, 801, 802, 804, 805, 806, 807, 808, 810, 812, 813, 815, 816, 822; (No. 810 has a detached cover, see photos).
