Beautiful Chinese porcelain "Batavia ware" bowl from the Qianlong period (1736-1795).

The interior finely painted in underglaze blue with five fish swimming among stylised aquatic plants, symbolising abundance and prosperity (yú ?). The exterior covered with a rich, glossy iron-brown glaze (Batavia brown).

Unglazed footring revealing the white porcelain body.

A fine and rare example of export porcelain, combining a symbolic blue-and-white fish pattern with the characteristic Batavia-brown exterior.

Such motifs are uncommon within this type and highly sought after by collectors of 18th-century Chinese export wares.
