### Description

Large lamp consisting of five closed tubes made of frosted glass with white speckles, set in a chrome-plated metal frame. Five lights. Height: 65 cm (25.6 inches) Base diameter: 25 cm (9.8 inches) Biography Aldo Nason (1920), Italian designer belonging to a large family of glassmakers, is the son of Emilio Nason, one of the founders in 1932 of the collective of master glassmakers Arte Vetraria Muranese (AVEM). AVEM first directed its research towards obtaining precious chromatic effects with inclusions of gold and silver and used "pulegoso" glass, invented in the 1920s in Murano by Martinuzzi, made up of numerous small air bubbles. produced by the addition of baking soda, which gives the glass an irregular texture with a very decorative finish.
