Circular dish with a yellow glazed earthenware umbilicus with a slightly marked decoration in the center of the umbilicus, the letter R on a white background and between two glaze bands, a pseudo-epigraphic band, then on the rim raised foliage and solfa* motifs interspersed with simplified wild licorice leaves. Seville, Spain. First half of the 16th century. Diameter: 31 cm. One original attachment hole. * solfa: abstract decoration alternating dots and tight lines reminiscent of musical notes. Cf.
