Description Egyptian limestone fragment dating
from the 18th Dynasty (1550-1292 BC), depicting
the lower half of a figure seated on a throne,
engraved with hieroglyphs. Acquired by Count
von Rosen, a prolific author, explorer, and friend
of Howard Carter in the 1920s, this fragment was
displayed at Rockelstad at that time. Count Eric
von Rosen (1879-1948) was a Swedish explorer,
ethnographer, and collector, known for his deep
fascination with ancient cultures. At his family
estate, Rockelstad Castle, he amassed an
impressive collection of Egyptian antiquities,
