The naturally curved root has been shaped to form an elegant boat-like form, known as a Take-no-zutsu Hanaire -- a "bamboo tube flower vase." An everyday masterpiece (chef-d'oeuvre ordinaire), this vessel embodies the wabi-sabi aesthetic -- natural simplicity, quiet elegance, and the beauty of imperfection. Its soft polished patina reflects a century of use and care. Length: 26 cm Height: 15 cm Diameter: 7.5-11 cm Excellent antique condition, with a smooth, warm patina consistent with age and use. Ikebana -- The Art of Presenting Nature Ikebana, literally "the way of flowers," is the Japanese art of floral arrangement -- one of the three traditional arts of refinement, along with the tea ceremony (chanoyu) and the incense
