The gem, cut with cut corners, sits at the center of a sunburst motif in brushed matte yellow gold, its vibrant and lively chiseled design evoking bursts of gold. Around this central stone, four oval-cut citrines of a luminous golden yellow sparkle, accentuating the chromatic richness and brilliance of the piece. The powerful yet balanced composition testifies to great artistry and high-level jewelry
