



Signed Pair Of Satsuma Wisteria Vases By Tagawa, Kyoto, C. 1900-1920

Description

A delicately matched pair of signed Kyoto Satsuma vases, painted by Tagawa (??) around 1900-1915. Exemplifying refined craftsmanship and subtle colour balance, they demonstrate the quiet luxury of Japan's Meiji-Taisho decorative arts.

Each vase has an ovoid form with narrow neck and flared rim. The shoulders are encircled by a brocade-style band of enameled lappets and scalework motifs in blue, green, and iron-red with gold accents. Below, cascading wisteria blossoms are painted in lilac and ivory enamel tones with lavish raised gilding. The gold detailing is minute and rhythmic, creating a luminous surface reminiscent of textile brocade.
