Description

Late 19th century France - Auvergne - Massif Central - Haute-Loire. An object of work and transmission, this carved wooden lacemaker's folder illustrates the rich symbolism and coded language of the folk arts of the Massif Central. Made from a single piece of wood, it features two large, finely gridded oval medallions, evoking two stylized sunflowers, surrounded by a network of triangulated friezes and rhythmic borders with lively lines. The whole, with its vibrant geometry, seems to articulate both the lacemaker's gesture and the movement of the sun, linking the work of the thread to the passage of time. Each incision, carved with patience and precision, is both a utilitarian and expressive act: a scraping surface, a protective decoration, a personal offering, or a discreet message.
