Description

China, late 19th century, Qing dynasty. Guanyin seated, holding the answering pearl. The bodhisattva is depicted seated, wearing a flowing gold cloak with pronounced folds. Her right hand holds a sphere adorned with a small finial, identified as the cintamani, or answering pearl, a symbol of compassion and spiritual fulfillment. Her head is adorned with a lotus-shaped topknot, surmounted by a circular medallion repainted in the shape of an eye, likely in the place of a former effigy of Amitabha, Guanyin's tutelary deity. The overall expression of serenity and contemplation exemplifies the temple sculptures produced at the end of the Qing dynasty. Dimensions: 43 x 19 cm
