Motif: Poppies** This impressive lidded vase comes from the renowned FA Mehlem GmbH factory in Bonn, one of the most important German ceramic manufacturers of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Founded in 1838 and later established on the historic site of the former Bonn earthenware factory, Mehlem was internationally acclaimed in its time for the refinement of its forms and the quality of its artistic decoration. Hand-painted Art Nouveau pieces were particularly prized and are now highly sought-after collector's items. The vase presented here is a prime example: a large Art Nouveau vase with elegant curves, fitted with a lid and richly decorated with an Impressionist-inspired poppy motif. The vibrant

shades of pink, red, and purple blend harmoniously with deep green hues - a color palette typical of floral Art Nouveau. Particularly valuable: this vase is signed W. Dreimüller, one of the decorative painters at the Mehlem factory, whose delicate floral paintings adorn several high-quality pieces from this period.
