Tapestries require special care; the ravages of time, humidity, dust, occasional moth holes, wear from friction, and sun exposure are all factors that not only alter the aesthetics of tapestries but also damage their textile fibers. Woven works require periodic cleaning and partial restoration. Even a simple washing can give a spectacular new brilliance to a soiled tapestry. To accurately assess the condition of a tapestry, it is advisable to consult a tapestry expert before making any purchase. While it may be tempting to buy at auction in the hope of a lower price, extreme caution is necessary, as descriptions in sales catalogs or online are often approximate and sometimes misleading. Terms like "some wear," "minor damage," or "partially restored" can conceal deterioration requiring costly restoration. A proper cleaning will remove accumulated dust and restore lost luster. Subsequently, the stitching at the points where the weave changes color is often loose; the threads will need tightening to prevent the cracks from worsening, and in some cases, missing sections will need to be rewoven. Finally, to stabilize the tapestry's condition and improve its durability, the back should be covered with a protective fabric, with the Velcro fastening system sewn in place.
