

## Large Imari Baluster Vase Decorated With Landscapes - Japan, Edo, Late 17th/early 18th Century

Large baluster vase with a long flared neck in Arita porcelain, decorated in the Imari palette with lakeside landscapes in fan-shaped reserves and red and gold chrysanthemums and peonies on a blue ground, and decorated with gilt floral scrolls. Japan, Edo period (1603-1868) Late 17th - Early 18th century (1690-1720) Height: 48.7cm. These vases are commonly mounted in bronze, and most often pierced by electricity; this one is unaltered.
