AVIAN-FIGURED FISHING HOOK Tlingit culture, British Columbia First half of the 20th century Wood, iron, and natural fibers H: 24; W: 4.5 cm Carved wooden fishhook used for fishing halibut, also known as halibut, with a shaft entirely carved with incisions representing a bird figure, whose beak forms the upper end of the instrument. Iron barb.
