He was known for his ability to capture the likeness and personality of his subjects with great skill and sensitivity. Tocqué was born in Paris and trained with the famous portrait painter Hyacinthe Rigaud. He became a member of the Royal Academy of Painting and Sculpture in 1720 and pursued a brilliant career as a portrait painter, receiving numerous commissions from members of the French aristocracy and royalty. Our painting is representative of the Rococo portrait, with its delicate brushwork and soft, pastel colors. Tocqué was able to capture the discreet charm of the model as well as her elegance echoing her

intelligence and spirit. Tocqué's portraits are characterized by attention to detail. He was good at capturing facial expressions, refined postures and the delicacy of fabrics.
