Closed frame; single and double action. Unlocking key with push button and upward tilt. The system allows collective extraction by a bracket fixed on top with jaws pushing the extractor. Six-chamber cylinder, stamped. Finely checkered walnut grip panels; grip cap fitted with a ring on a stud. Both revolvers are in perfect condition, with a 100% nickel-plated finish. Walnut box, screwed, with brass badge. The interior is lined with blue felt, and the inside of the lid has retained its original label. It contains a grease pot and a cleaning rod. Lock with key. The configuration of this case certainly makes it a unique piece. This collective extraction system was patented by Stanley Hill in the early 1870s.
