Large pair of bronze two-branch candlesticks, decorated with crowned double-headed eagle heads. 19th century. The double-headed eagle, or double-headed eagle, is a symbol found in heraldry. The oldest representations of the double-headed eagle appear in the 3rd millennium BC.
