and grapes, their mouths open in the manner of
ancient theatrical masks, forming fountain spouts
framed by vine shoots and branches, as well as
leaves and bunches of grapes. Bacchus, the god
of wine, Dionysia, Bacchanalia, fauns and satyrs,
probably allegorical figures relating to the god
Bacchus. A plaster sculpture patinated in the
manner of terracotta. A plaster sculpture from the
late 19th century in very high relief and in perfect
condition. in the manner of ancient theatrical
masks and fountain spouts, an unusual sculpture
