## Description

An elegant Louis XIII period table, crafted from a regional hardwood--traditionally walnut or "gaillac," a species prized in Southwest France for its density and warm brown tone. The piece exhibits all the characteristics of early 17th-century French furniture, with a harmonious balance between architectural simplicity and refined woodturning. The rectangular top is framed by a wide, molded border, worn by time with an authentic, untouched patina. The apron is adorned with a beautiful scalloped decoration, typical of provincial productions from Languedoc or Southwest France around 1620-1650. The four legs with their regular twisted shape demonstrate masterful woodturning, one of the most emblematic motifs of the Louis XIII style. They are connected by a shaped X-shaped spacer,
