A very fine original etching by Lucien Gautier (1850-1925), the renowned Parisian engraver specializing in views of Old Paris, its quays, bridges, and the Seine. This print depicts Notre-Dame Cathedral as seen from the Pont de l'Archevêché, with barges, riverbanks, barrels, and all the lively river life of the late 19th century. This is a proof with lettering, bearing the original publisher's markings: "Pont de l'Archevêché à Paris" (title) "Lucien Gautier del. et sculp." "L. Endès Imp." (Parisian printer) "L'Art" (illustrated magazine that published this print) This series of etchings was published in the 1880s-1890s and is one of the artist's most sought-after sets.
