This refined 19th-century Corsican stiletto is distinguished by the purity of its lines and the quality of its steel blade, polished to a mirror shine. Single-edged with a perfectly clear false edge, the blade features a clean ricasso and a superbly executed thumb rest, characteristics of traditional Corsican craftsmanship. The remarkably elegant handle consists of a grip formed by alternating layers of finely striated horn rings, punctuated by delicate brass washers. The whole is framed by a brass ferrule and bolster, the precise workmanship of which gives it a highly refined finish. The original scabbard,
