It portrays a charming genre scene: market women from the Norman bocage, seated and preparing their stall of fresh vegetables, brought early to sell to customers in the city of Rouen, on a lovely early summer morning. It will be hot when the customers arrive as the morning draws to a close. An elderly woman has opened her beautiful red parasol... And all these ladies, wearing traditional headdresses, are numerous and lined up, waiting patiently... The year is 1840, at the faithful vegetable market located in front of the Chapel of
