Description

A sophisticated pair of Kyoto Satsuma vases from the Kinkozan workshop, made c.1890-1905. Deep cobalt shoulders and bases anchor the composition, while the bodies carry finely painted garden scenes of women reading and making music, contrasted with floral panels of peonies, bamboo and butterflies. Raised gold maple leaves and soft ivory crackle grounds add visual richness without overwhelming the compact scale. One vase is signed ??? (Kinkozan); the second is clearly its companion.
