Extremely Rare Imperial German Naval Officer's Sword with Damascus BladePeriod: circa 1900-1914An outstanding and extremely rare deluxe Imperial German naval officer's sword, featuring a highly unusual lion-head pommel with one green and one red glass eye -- a very scarce variant among known examples. The lion's head is of a rare sculptural type with exceptionally fine detailing and a powerful expression, symbolizing strength and command. The gilded brass guard is richly pierced and engraved with floral scrolls and the Imperial crown over a fouled anchor, representing the Kaiserliche Marine. The white grip, bound with gilt wire, remains in excellent condition and retains the original silver-and-red bullion portépée. The magnificent Damascus steel blade displays a beautiful watered pattern
