Description

Dating: Late 19th century. Origin: France -Massif Central, Auvergne. Small shepherd's cup, carved from wood, for personal use. This type of very small object often accompanied shepherds or peasants on their daily journeys, used for drinking a small glass of brandy or wine during rest stops. The body is richly decorated with a naive carved design representing a bart, a popular term for the symbolic bird in the pastoral art of the Massif Central, a figure associated with the soul, protection, and benevolent presence. The bird is depicted perched on a leafy branch, framed by serrated friezes running along the rim and base. The whole exudes a touching power through its intimate and symbolic nature: a pocket-sized, utilitarian object, but also one that carries an emotional and protective dimension. The wood

The style is straightforward and spontaneous, typical of Auvergne folk art from the late 19th century, made on a potter's wheel and then finished with a knife.
