Lacquered Wooden plate In The "arte Povera" Style. Turin, 18th Century. Ø 51 x 51 cm. A rare and fascinating decorative polychrome wooden plate, a remarkable example of the 18th-century Piedmontese lacquer tradition, or "arte povera," a decorative technique that was particularly popular in Piedmont as an economical alternative to expensive oriental lacquers. The plate features a complex decorative composition organized across multiple concentric registers. At the center, within a circle framed by a gold border, is a bucolic landscape with lush trees and a path. In the middle band, against a vermilion red background, four large polylobed cartouches enclose views of fantastical architecture and architectural capricci against a turquoise background. Among these are monumental

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bridges with statues and obelisks, always enriched with naturalistic elements. The work is made using the "lacca povera" or "arte povera" technique, a process that involved applying hand-colored engraved prints to a wooden support and then protecting them with layers of transparent varnish to imitate the effect of oriental lacquers.
