LIGHT CAVALRY OR ARTILLERY OFFICER'S SABRE, First Empire. 32695. Brass hilt. Three-branch guard with quillons. Long-tailed pommel. Beechwood grip covered in black waxed calfskin with copper wire inlay; it is fitted with an oval brass stud on each side. Curved, fullered blade, 84.7 cm long, with a raised back, richly engraved and gilded on each side and on the first third with trophies of arms, floral decorations, and the crowned imperial eagle with outstretched wings, all on a blued ground; it is signed in a central cartouche on the front of the blade, "Coulaux / Frères" and on the back, "manufacture / de / Klingenthal". Scarlet wool sword knot. Scabbard entirely of brass, engraved on the front with laurel branches, an oak branch, trophies of arms, and acanthus flowers and
