Produced shortly before World War I for officers of the Imperial Russian cavalry under Tsar Nicholas II, this example combines refined Solingen craftsmanship with distinct Russian Imperial symbolism. The gently curved, single-edged blade with triple fullers is etched on one side with the Imperial double-headed eagle, and on the reverse with the monogram "N II"

The weapon is accompanied by its original metal scabbard with two suspension rings, showing honest age wear and patina while remaining complete and structurally sound.
