Description

Japanese embroidery made of Yuzen-Birodo velvet depicting a sacred pagoda on a small island off the coast. On the mainland, beyond the forest, several buildings can be seen, and in the background, a sailboat is sailing on the sea. Japan, Meiji era (1868-1912). Dimensions with frame: 62.5 x 62.5 cm. Dimensions without frame: 52.5 x 52.5 cm. The Yuzen-Birodo technique was invented by Nishimura Sozaemon of Kyoto in 1868. The velvet was woven by passing threads through fine metal wires parallel to the weft, then cut to form the pile. The precise cutting allowed for a three-dimensional effect. Good condition, slight signs of wear. Framed under glass. Free shipping within the European Union! I send packages via insured mail (DPD or DHL). All items are packaged very carefully.
