Description

Magnificent and rare lamp in patinated bronze and marble. It depicts the famous Flying Mercury after the original created by Giambologna and housed in the Louvre Museum. Mercury is shown with his right arm raised towards the sky and holding a caduceus in his left hand. Standing on the tip of his toe, he is propelled by the winds of the god Aeolus. His right hand holds the electrical mechanism. Marble base. It is rare to see this sculpture mounted as a lamp. New electrical system, pleated canvas shade. 19th century. Delivery by carrier: EUR50 in France, EUR100 in the EU, and EUR200 for the rest of the world.
