Exceptional diplomatic gift from the Sultanate of Oman, presented to a French national responsible for foreign affairs.

Gold-colored commemorative plaque offered by the Sultan's Armed Forces Museum, located in Muscat, Oman. This prestigious protocol item features a central engraving depicting the museum building--an old fortress (Bait Al Falaj Fort)--topped with the official emblem of the Omani Armed Forces: a khanjar (traditional curved dagger) set over two crossed rifles, surrounded by a laurel wreath and topped with a royal crown. Inscriptions appear in both Arabic and English.
