The bowl is cast in low relief with a pattern of stylized roses and trees. An inscription around the base reads: "AND THE MUSK OF THE ROSE IS BLOWN AND THE WOODBINE SPICES ARE WAFTED ABROAD". The inscription is a line from the poem *The Tree of Life* by Alfred, Lord Tennyson. The item is pattern number 011 and is often sold at auction.
