Origin and Use: This method is primarily employed in prestigious workshops such as the Manufacture d'Aubusson in France. It is used to

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create tapestries or textile works where each stitch is made by hand, allowing for very precise and durable results.

Technique: Threads of wool, silk, or linen are individually pierced into the support's warp using a special needle. Each motif is entirely hand-stitched, unlike industrial tapestries where weaving is mechanical. This technique produces subtle relief and highly detailed patterns, highly valued in textile art.

Advantages: A tapestry made with the "Point Piqûre Main" technique is unique, of exceptional quality, and durable. It can be considered a work of art rather than mere decoration.
