Description

Hard-paste-type soft porcelain with polychrome enamels and original gilding. A well-modelled pair of Derby musicians from the Patch Period, c.1765. The bagpiper with a hound and the mandolin player with a lamb appear in the theatrical masquerade style noted by Bradshaw ("Derby Porcelain Figures 1750-1848", p.85). They correspond to the E13 model described on pp.96-97. Constructed with the heavier Derby bocage of the mid-1760s, the figures include a vent hole to prevent explosion during firing. Their design follows models created by Saxonian sculptors Johann Joachim Kändler and Peter Reinicke. Preserved gilding is remarkable; the hound retains three original spikes. Each base shows firing lines and the raised supports for former candle nozzles. Dimensions: Male figure:
