Statuette of Shakyamuni Buddha Burma 19th century  
The Buddha is depicted seated on a high pedestal adorned with stylized lotus petals, his legs crossed in the vajraparyanka position. His right hand rests on his knee in bhumisparshamudra, a symbolic gesture of victory over inner demons and the activation of the Earth as a witness to his awakening. His left hand is placed in his lap, palm facing upward. The Awakened One wears an uttarasangha close to his body, as well as a long samghati draped over his left shoulder, both delicately crafted. His face is characterized by subtle comma-shaped brow ridges above lenticular eyes, an aquiline nose with dilated nostrils above a thin mouth that forms a slight smile. The neck displays the three beauty lines, the forehead is adorned with a wide
