A Boulle period courtesy table from the Napoleon III era, crafted from ebonized wood and embellished with fine marquetry featuring geometric and ribbon motifs, typical of the Neoclassical style. The apron is punctuated by finely chased gilt bronze mounts, including a particularly expressive central mascarón, framed by drops and decorative elements of excellent quality, both in casting and chasing. The table rests on four tapered and fluted legs, ending in gilt bronze sabots, connected by an X-shaped stretcher centered with a turned and gilt element, lending stability and architectural elegance to the whole.
